however it has opened up
endless possibilities.

2020 EVENTS

The Covid-19 pandemic has resulted in a large majority of the 2020 summer shows and events being cancelled. Refunds of stand bookings are being processed however the Society has carried forward the stand bookings for the Royal Highland Show and Royal Welsh Show, 2021 with no additional charges.

WELSHPOOL, CASTLE DOUGLAS, WINTER FAIR

The Society is in regular contact with all of the organisations involved in hosting the Welshpool sale, the premier sale at Castle Douglas and the Royal Welsh Winter Fair. At this moment in time we are continuing to monitor the situation closely and hope that perhaps some form of normality will have returned by then however should strict restrictions still be in place the Society will look to alternative methods to ensure there is a platform to promote and sell cattle for members.

DNA FOR SIRES

If members intend registering calves it is vitally important that a DNA sample is taken from the sire and submitted for testing before the bull is put out with the cows / heifers. As we are all too aware. bulls can hurt themselves and this is a costly business in itself however not being able to register the calves is an unnecessary additional cost. DNA is significant for all parties and as a breed Society we have an obligation to ensure every pedigree that is issued is correct in its content, and as is being proven at the moment, mistakes can be costly. As a Society which all of you are part of, we must take advantage of the technology available to ensure that the information submitted is accurate. Without proof of parentage it is very difficult to meet the requirements of registration.

VIDEO TOURS

To complement the member profiles that have appeared on the website and social media the Council would also like to feature farm / herd tours and diaries via video. If you would like to be involved send a series of short video clips of your family, farm and herd to Sian, email: secretary@salers.uk She will edit these and upload online. It is lovely to see other people's farms and methods but also this will provide historical data to look back at and compare year on year.

AREA REPRESENTATIVES

Earlier this week election paperwork was issued to members located in the relevant areas. In accordance with the Articles of Association, the following Council Members retire having served their elected appointment to the Council of Management. Area 3, Wales, Harri Pritchard, Area 7, Mid-West England, Bryn Robinson and Area 8, South West England, Malcolm Light. Council have taken the decision to split Area 3 and have two representatives, representing Wales. Area 3a will cover South Wales and Mid-Wales and Area 3b will cover North Wales. Therefore, two nominations are sought.

PERFORMANCE RECORDING

It is extremely important that members where possible weigh their calves at birth and submit the birth weights along with their registrations and intimations. We also encourage members to record and submit whole herd information including steers, as the larger the group recorded under the same management conditions the more accurate the results. It would be most beneficial, if more commercial herds were to submit performance records, these tend to be larger stocking groups with consistent feeding and management across the herd.

After each breed has been judged, we will then move on to the inter-breeds where, specially chosen judges will make the difficult choice of picking an overall winner of the beef, dairy, sheep and heavy horse sections.

FOCUS

Inevitably the current climate has meant a shift in office priorities. The cancellation of shows and sales has driven the renovation of a platform for members to advertise their stock for sale utilising the current website and social media. The creation of the Salers Cattle Society – For Sale catalogue on breedplan has been very successful giving potential buyers' a complete list of stock for sale linked to breeding information, performance figures and contact details. As part of this process it has become very apparent that our current website is not sophisticated enough to deal with the technical requirements of uploading videos etc. and therefore, we have moved the update of the website forward. This will mean that we will host our own site, have access to statistics and have a great deal more control over how the site is managed going forward.

As part of this process we have also obtained a much 'slicker' website address www.salers.uk and email address, secretary@salers.uk Both these will 'go live' once the website is ready to be launched and to ensure we do not miss visitors to the site the 'old' website will point to the new address.

THE GREATEST ONLINE AGRICULTURAL SHOW



The Society hosted a stand at the above event held on Saturday 2nd May 2020. These events covered unchartered territory. There were some 'teething' difficulties however it demonstrated what is possible and showed a huge commitment from the agricultural community and beyond to try something new and raised in excess of £16k for some very worthwhile charities.

AHDB REPORT

Across the board GB deadweight cattle prices have continued on an upwards trend. During the week ending 30 May, the allprime average measure increased 7.5p week-on-week, to £3.45/kg. For the first time in quite a while prices are within touching distance of the fiveyear average. Estimated kill for the week totalled 31,300 head, down 1.700 head week-onweek. It is likely some of these cattle were brought forward due to concerns over the dry hot weather.



IMPORTS

To simplify and speed up the import registration process I have outlined below the necessary paperwork required.

Please note the laboratories now require DNA profiles to be sent in excel format (.xls) to enable an electronic upload of the profile to their database without manual intervention, thus preventing the risk of human error.

ALL CATTLE

It is recommended that all cattle are tested free from bluetongue prior to importation and confirmation of the negative test result sent to the Society.

Failure to produce this documentation will delay the process with the Society instead requiring a copy of the DEFRA Revocation of Notice Prohibiting the Movement of Specific Animals (MR04).

In accordance with the EU Zootechnical Regulations 2016, the Society will maintain an accurate record of Salers animals and genetic material (semen, embryos, oocytes) born in or imported to the UK (the Herdbook).

This comprises a Main Herd
Register containing two Classes,
Full Blood and Purebred.
N.B. imported animals can only
be entered into the class
equivalent to the class that
they have been registered in
within their own Country.

FEMALES

Imported females must have:

- a three-generation pedigree export certificate issued by the Society of the country of origin;
- confirmation of their noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM); and,
- confirmation of their M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations via a DNA test.

N.B. Status by parentage for betamannosidosis (BetaM) and myostatin is specifically not accepted.

MALES

Imported males must have:

- a three-generation pedigree export certificate issued by the Society of the country of origin;
- a DNA profile sent to the Society in excel format (.xls);
- confirmation of their noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM); and,
- confirmation of their M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations via a DNA test.

N.B. Status by parentage for betamannosidosis (BetaM) and myostatin is specifically not accepted.

PREGNANT FEMALES

Pregnant imported cattle must have:

- a three-generation pedigree export certificate issued by the Society of the country of origin;
- confirmation of their noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM);
- confirmation of their M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations via a DNA test;
- a three-generation pedigree certificate issued by the Society of the country of origin for the sire of the invitro calf.
- the sire's DNA profile in excel format (.xls);
- confirmation of the sire's noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM); and,
- confirmation of the sire's M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations via a DNA test.

The same principles apply to imported semen, and oocytes.

As requirements of importation can change, please check with the Secretary's office to confirm what is required before you start the importation procedure.

EMBRYOS

The sire and dam of embryos must be registered in the UK Herdbook. Each flush must be registered to obtain an embryo number eg.186/3, which is then used to identify the resulting calf when registered.

Calf names will be followed by the letters ET on the certificate. In the case of all calves got by ET, the following paperwork is required:

DAM

- the DNA profile of the dam, if the DNA profile relates to an animal out with the UK this should be sent to the Society in excel format (.xls);
- confirmation of the dam's noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM);
- Confirmation of the dams M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations

SIRE

- a DNA profile of the sire, if the DNA profile relates to an animal out with the UK then this should be sent to the Society in excel format (.xls);
- confirmation of the sire's noncarrier status for betamannosidosis (BetaM); and,
- Confirmation of the sires M0 myostatin status for all nine mutations.

N.B. Status by parentage for betamannosidosis (BetaM) and myostatin is specifically not accepted for sires and dams from out with the UK.

IMPORTED EMBRYO

 A three-generation export certificate issued by the Society of the country of origin.




To ensure buyers and breeders alike have all the information they require the Certificates of Pedigree have been updated to include the following information:

Richard Tudor

Members of the Salers Cattle Society alongside the farming fraternity, as a whole, were astounded and deeply saddened by the untimely and truly premature passing of our friend, former member and livestock producer Richard Tudor, on 3 April 2020.

Richard was named Farmers Weekly Beef Farmer of the Year in 2016 after he wowed the judges with his impressive business performance.

The efficient management of his 290ha Welsh upland farm was singled out as a shining example of how beef enterprises can thrive, even in the toughest of climates. The judges praised him for outstanding gross margins of £704 a cow - £100 above the best Welsh upland farms on average.

In 2018, Richard completed a Nuffield scholarship in soil health and fertility in the grasslands, an essential component in improving upland beef and sheep productivity and sustainability. The same year, he decided to sell his suckler herd and convert to dairy farming, citing Brexit as the catalyst and the "headache" of the threat of bovine TB.

Richard was a highly respected farmer who was very active in his local community. He was a coach at his local young farmers' club and was chair of the board of governors at his local primary school Ysgol Dyffryn Banw, in Llangadfan.

Our thoughts are with Richard's family and friends.

LOWER BOLIE SALERS

My father Brian and I, (Pearse) run a herd of 30 Salers cows in Greysteel, Co Derry. Our farm is at our home house in "in the hills of Killywool" which overlooks Lough Foyle. Due to work commitments we farm on a part time basis. We were on the lookout for easy calving cows, and to be able to produce a good calf for the weanling market.

We kept a mixture of cows, using beef shorthorn AI to breed replacements. We then came across an advert for the "ultimate suckler cow" on the internet. With Simmental and Belgian blue heifers ready to AI at the time we thought we would give the Salers bull a go, although we were told by the AI man "go and get your head looked they are wild!!!" Needless to say, we didn't listen to him and went ahead and tried them out - Sure enough when it came to calving time the heifers all calved themselves and the calves were up and sucking in minutes!

We then saw a sale of pedigree Salers Cows with Charolais calf's at foot sold at our local market and the consistent yellow calf made our minds up! Our first 2 pedigree heifers were purchased in 2012 from Ballykeel Salers (Co Down). Now 8 years on, we have weaned out all other breeds apart from one shorthorn cow and the rest are all pure Salers! We have built our herd from buying heifers off some of the top herds in the North and South of Ireland and with using Al Salers bulls. All our pedigree Salers heifers so far have been retained in our herd for breeding.

Our first Salers bull was purchased in 2018, Brookfields Majestic at 7 months old from Geoff Wilson, Dromore, Co Down. Our best selection of cows and heifers are put to the Salers and the rest go to the Culard Charolais.

Salers cows are renowned for being "easy calved" this in our experience is true. We only have to assist our cows at calving when there is a problem, such as; a calf coming backwards or a leg down! The golden calf - Our Salers x Charolais calves are born from February to April. They are sold at the weanling sales coming off the cow in October, and with a uniform batch of calves they look incredibly well at the market!

Lower Bolie Salers first started showing in 2016 with LowerBolie Kizzy, who stood 1st in her class at Omagh and Castlewellan. In 2017 we then purchased 3 heifers - Brookfields Abbey, Eva and Rosheen for foundation to breed top quality stock. We then went onto win champion at Newry show. 2018 was a good year on the show circuit! Home bred heifer Lower Bolie Molly was 1st in her class in 6 shows out of 8 and stood reserve champion at Clougher Valley show. Eva was res champion at Balmoral show and champion at Armagh, Newry, Saintfield and Castlewellan. Eva and Molly went on to win junior and senior female of the year 2018!


